



## Stamford Vision: Urban

### Notes from the meeting on 14.06.04

#### 1. Updates on

- a. Traffic issues: A meeting was set up between GH, GR, CLH and JP to discuss future strategy.
- b. The River:
  - Canoe survey underway
  - Benches on Water Street need maintaining. JK to undertake a survey of the benches to see what self-help maintenance the group might be able to do. Tim Metcalfe Kemp from SKDC undertakes general maintenance and might be a good contact. AH suggests that Vic Couzens should be approached as he has expressed an interest in the work undertaken for the sensory garden. GR to contact.
  - Access to river: JK to contact Candy Reid about funding a study.
  - Access alongside the river: CC to contact Duncan Lucas at SKDC about cycle access.
- c. Litter bins: These are expected from America on the 8<sup>th</sup> July, should anyone know a location for secure storage please let AH know. RB and AH are going to do a walkabout later this week to establish the refurbishment needs of each of the 'cascaded' bins. CC's installation specification for the new and refurbished bins is for there to be;
  - for fixing down the bin an approximate concrete foundation for each bin of 450x450x450mm,
  - the paving surface to be reinstated to match the existing.After some discussion about the importance of preserving York stone paving where it exists, RB and AH agreed to make notes on what impact this would have on the installations on the walkabout. LCC should be approached to give a cost for installation and AH will contact the preferred contractors on SKDC's list to get a price.
- d. Signposts: These have now been received at SKDC's depot. AH to let CC know what fingers have been received so that the final arrangements for installation can be agreed.

#### 2. AOB:

- a. Stamford in Bloom's planting on Sheep Market is suffering in the hot weather and one of the trees is turning brown. AH to check to see whether these pots can be added onto SKDC's rota for the watering in this first year whilst the trees are becoming established.
- b. The path across Vence Walk looks good and it would be useful to try and obtain some positive publicity. Once the edges have been reseeded this should be done.
